Thoughts and Insights from Worship

Monday, June 9 – Mark 2:1-5

What role did the paralytics friends play in his healing? Read the passage again and notice just how determined they were to get help for their friend. Who are your “stretcher bearers”? For whom are you a stretcher bearer? Do you have a friend or co-worker who needs a bit of encouragement today?

Tuesday, June 10 – Matthew 6:25-34

This passage teaches that we deal should with the present, and not worry about the future. Are your fears and concerns mostly about something that's happening, or about something that you fear might happen? How do fears about the future affect your daily life and relationships?

Wednesday, June 11 – Ecclesiastes 4:9-12

This passage points, again, to the importance of cultivating companions who help anchor and support you, and who you anchor and support, during the storms. Who is the third strand of the cord in verse 12?

Thursday, June 12 – Psalm 91:1-4

In what way does God fulfill this passage of scripture? What would these words mean to someone facing a life threatening illness? How is God our fortress even in tragedy or in the face of death?

Friday, June 13 – Proverbs 3:5-8

How does this passage of ancient Hebrew wisdom summarize the teaching of this week's scriptures? Whose wisdom are you depending on the most—your own or God's? What does it mean to trust in the Lord in the face of storms and setbacks?

Dear God, help me to trust in you. Help me to turn my worries over to you every time I start to become anxious. Fill my heart and my mind with your peace. Help me to be a “stretcher bearer” for others, serving as your hands and voice to care for them. In Jesus' Name. Amen.
