Worship Preparation for MARCH 22TH

Text: : John 5:1-15

Questions Jesus is Asking: ...

Do you want to be Made Well?

We are continuing our Lenten sermon series on "Questions Jesus is Asking." This coming Sunday, we will examine the question: "Do you want to be made Well?" From the Gospel of John, we will learn that Jesus asks a lame man if he would like to be made well. The man was healed and Jesus told him to sin no more. When we look at our individual lives, there are two paths for "made well." There is the obvious path of physical wellbeing, and the second is spiritually well. We will explore being made spiritually well as we continue to prepare ourselves through Lent to receive the grace of our Lord, Christ Jesus. Our Lord awaits our response to his offer to be made well. Are you ready to take that next step and respond with a spiritually charged "yes?"

The Season of Lent through Pentecost - From Ashes to Fire

The coming seasons of the church calendar consist of Lent and Pentecost. Lent is forty days, beginning with Ash Wednesday and concluding with Easter morning worship. The next 50 days prepare for Pentecost, the birth of the church and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon all followers of Christ.

Lent is a period of repentance and renewal. In the early church, baptism and penance were key Lenten themes. Historically during Lent, candidates prepared for Easter baptism and people did public penance for serious sins. Today the emphasis is upon fasting and prayer, meditation and reflection on the meaning of Easter. Fasting and Prayer have been important observances since biblical times. Lent is a time to simplify. Not so we can get rid of things we like, but to make room for the presence of God in our lives. These disciplines have often preceded great religious revelations or events. Here are some examples to read:

Exodus 34:27-28. Moses fasted and prayed for 40 days during the time that God gave him the code of the law as the Ten Commandments.

Kings 19:1-18. Elijah fled for his life through the wilderness, fasting 40 days and nights until he came to Mt. Horeb. There, God appeared and instructed him on how to overcome enemies.

Luke 4:1-13. After baptism, Jesus withdrew to the desert to fast and pray for 40 days before beginning His public ministry.

Consider how you might use this season to grow in your faith and draw closer to God. You can never know the full meaning of Easter without the 40 days of wilderness and the reflection upon what Christ has done for us through his life, death and resurrection. The empty grave (God's promise of victory over death) must be seen through the shadow of the cross (God's sacrificial gift). God's love for us led to humility and sacrifice. How might we return thanks during this season? Maybe journey through this season with others at Sugar River to deepen your understanding and experience of God's love in Christ Jesus. We will also look at the importance of forgiveness and take time to journal and pray. Each Wednesday night in Lent, the church will be available for times of guided prayer.

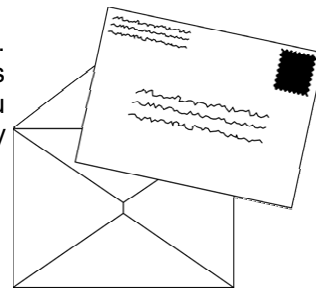
Following Lent, you may experience a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit. That takes us from the ashes of Lent (the sign of repentance) to the flame of Pentecost (the power of the Holy Spirit).

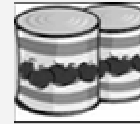

February-March Mission of the Month: Energy Assistance Program

Have you seen an increase in your utility bills this winter? Did you put your children to bed at 7:00 last night, not because it was their bedtime, but because it was the only way to keep them warm? Will you decide tomorrow whether to pay the overdue heating bill or buy groceries to feed your family this week? Are you dreading April 15th, not because it is tax day, but because that is the date by which your utility bills must be paid or you will lose your subsidized housing and possibly face homelessness? Are you feeling blessed right now that you answered yes to only the first question?

Many families in the Verona area who are on low or fixed incomes would answer yes to one or more of the other questions. While utilities cannot be disconnected for nonpayment during the winter months, the moratorium for that ends April 15th. If utility bills are not current at that time, families living in subsidized housing stand to lose that assistance. The result can be devastating to many.

What can we do? Ten dollars a day will provide heat and electricity for a needy family for a day. Can you sponsor a family for a day? a week? a month? Please add your pledge this Sunday. We have until March 15th to reach our goal of 150 days.
