

THE PROJECTS:

Serving Kitchen: We plan to complete the kitchen as a place to facilitate fellowship, growth, and healing for the broader Verona community. The kitchen will serve as a central point for events and speak to our values of sustainability. This space will be capable of serving weddings, funerals, emergencies and accommodate hands-on projects for youth.

Estimated Cost for Construction: \$267,000.00 Estimated Cost of Equipment: \$80,000.00

Station: Adding a level 2 charging station to the property will make our parking area a destination for the Verona community; it will provide members and neighbors with a convenient green commuting option. We anticipate being awarded a grant for almost half the cost of the charger. In time this project will pay for itself and later the income will be designated to offset debt.

Estimate Construction Cost (not including anticipated grant funds): \$17,000.00

Children's Area Enhancements: The children's area needs more work than this campaign can contribute at this time, however, a small amount of resources and sweat equity can make the space more inviting. We propose better lighting, paint, and minor upgrades that will create a more welcoming space for children to learn.

Estimated Construction Expenses: \$10,000.00

The Campaign Steering Committee is being expertly guided with support from the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation.
